2. The Directorate of Immigration of the Guatemalan Institute of Migration has the authority to grant or deny requested visas; therefore, it is not obligated to grant the requested migratory status.
3. Approved visas for foreign individuals do not imply unconditional admission to the territory of the Republic of Guatemala.
4. All information provided in this form is subject to verification by the Guatemalan Institute of Migration.
5. The information requested from the foreign individual should match the passport data, except for information not included in the passport.

Submit the application in gray color for entry, without erasures or alterations

1. Visa Application Form;
2. Original valid passport and a legalized complete copy. If the passport is not available, you may submit a certification of the complete passport issued by the competent authority, apostilled or in accordance with the Law of the Judiciary, as applicable;
3. Certification of the validity and expiration of the passport issued by the Embassy or Consulate of your country accredited in Guatemala. In case there is no diplomatic representation in the country, you must submit: a) Certification of the validity and expiration of the passport issued in a country different from the country of origin where it has diplomatic representation or b) Birth certificate. All foreign documents must be apostilled or in accordance with the Law of the Judiciary, as applicable;
4. Original certificate of a clean criminal record and valid police records issued by the competent authority in your country of origin, or in the country where you have legally resided for the last five years continuously, issued within six months, unless a different validity is specified in the document. These documents should be presented in Spanish if they are in a different language. The translation can be done by your embassy, by a recognized sworn translator in Guatemala, or in accordance with the regulations of the Law of the Judiciary, with apostilles or legal validations, as applicable. If the country or countries where you have resided for the past five years do not issue any of the above, have different document titles, or issue a single document for both records, you must submit a document issued by the competent authority of that country, indicating the refusal to issue the criminal or police records or an official statement clarifying the matter related to these documents. If the foreigner presents certificates from countries other than their country of origin, they must provide documentary evidence of legal residence in that country;
5. Proof of the economic capacity of the Guatemalan guarantor demonstrated through a recent income certificate, along with bank statements from the last three months reflecting income equivalent to five times the current minimum wage in Guatemala;
6. Transportation ticket, which should be round trip;
7. Guatemalan guarantor through whom the services will be provided, providing a notarized act of the constitution of the Guatemalan guarantor under oath and an updated certificate of the registration of the Guatemalan guarantor;
8. Original letter of request for services, issued by the public or private institution requesting the foreigner in Guatemala due to their expertise;
9. Proof of payment.

If the foreigner is required by a private institution, the following additional requirements must be attached:

<b>For business entities:</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Certificate, signed and sealed by the owner or legal representative of the entity where the foreigner will carry out the activity, indicating the duration, amount to be earned, the activity to be performed in the country, and the specialization for which they are required;</li><li>2. Certification of registration of the individual or corporate entity hiring them with the Commercial Registry;</li><li>3. Legalized copy of the Business License for the individual or company hiring them.</li></ol>	<b>For sports entities:</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Certificate signed and sealed by the legal representative of the entity where the foreigner will carry out the activity, indicating the duration, amount to be earned, and activity to be performed in the country;</li><li>2. Titles, diplomas, recognitions, or documents that prove expertise in the field of sports, with apostille or in accordance with the Law of the Judicial Organism, as applicable.</li></ol>
<b>For cultural entities:</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Certificate signed and sealed by the legal representative of the entity where the foreigner will carry out the activity, indicating the duration, amount to be earned, and activity to be performed in the country;</li><li>2. Certificate indicating that the entity is affiliated with a cultural institution, endorsed by the Ministry of Culture and Sports.</li></ol>	<b>For religious entities:</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Certificate signed and sealed, issued by the highest authority of the Catholic Church in Guatemala, indicating the duration and activity to be carried out in the country;</li><li>2. Legalized copy of the Personal Identification Document of the person representing the authorizing church;</li><li>3. For other churches, religious groups, entities, and associations, the statutes and appointments of the legal representative of the church, both in legalized copies.</li></ol>

OBSERVATIONS:

1. **FOREIGNER IDENTIFICATION:** If documents are presented where the foreigner is identified by multiple names, you must attach legal documentation issued by the appropriate authority that verifies the identity of the foreigner.
2. **GUATEMALAN GUARANTOR'S NOTARIAL ACT MUST INCLUDE:** (Individual Person) Tax Identification Number, Residential and Work Address, Residential and Work Telephone Number; (Legal Entities and International Institutions) Tax Identification Number, Fiscal and Commercial Address according to the social headquarters, and telephone number. In both cases, the Guatemalan guarantor must expressly state **"THEY ARE JOINTLY RESPONSIBLE FOR THE OBLIGATIONS THAT SUCH STATUS ENTAILS, UP TO A POSSIBLE RETURN AND/OR REPATRIATION; LIKEWISE, THEY UNDERTAKE TO INDICATE THE DATE OF THE FOREIGNER'S DEPARTURE OR CHANGE OF MIGRATION STATUS."**
3. **GUATEMALAN GUARANTOR:** They cannot simultaneously guarantee more than three tourist or traveler visa applications unless they are family members, in which case they must attach the legal documents proving the relationship to their application.
4. **NOTARIZED RESPONSIBILITY FOR EXPENSES ACT:** If traveling with per diems or paid expenses, please indicate and provide documentary proof.
5. **PASSPORT VALIDITY:** The passport where the Guatemalan visa will be stamped must have a minimum validity of 6 months.
6. **MULTIPLE VISA APPLICATION:** Depending on the documentation submitted with the visa application, a legal analysis will be conducted, and if the requirements are met, a multiple visa will be issued.
7. **RECENT PHOTOGRAPH:** Passport-size photo affixed to the front of this form and another photo for visa issuance purposes.
8. **TRANSPORTATION TICKET:** It must be issued with a validity period of more than 3 months from the date of the visa application.
9. **ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:** The Foreigners Subdirectorates may request additional information or documentation when necessary to clarify, expand, or correct what the visa applicant has submitted.
10. **AUTHORITY AND GROUNDS FOR DENYING GUATEMALAN VISAS:** The Guatemalan Institute of Migration, through the Foreigners Subdirectorates, has the authority to approve or deny visa applications, and the grounds for denial are listed in Article 7 of Agreement No. IGM-044-2023, Regulations for Guatemalan Visas, approved by National Migration Authority Agreement No. AMN 008-2023.
11. **ARCHIVING OF FILES DUE TO LACK OF INTEREST:** Files in which the foreign person has not taken action for a period of more than 6 months will be archived (Article 35 of Agreement No. IGM-044-2023, Regulations for Guatemalan Visas, approved by National Migration Authority Agreement No. AMN 008-2023).
12. **MIGRATION SERVICE FEES FOR VISAS:** The fee for visa application submitted within Guatemalan territory is twenty-five United States dollars (25.00 USD) or its equivalent in Quetzales.
13. **PRESERVATION AND RETURN OF DOCUMENTS FROM ABROAD:** clarifies that the documents that are attached to form files are perforated for safekeeping and custody; if the person wishes to keep them intact, they must be presented on protective sheets, it is recommended that at the time of entry of the application, have a true photocopy of the documents from abroad, to facilitate the return of the originals if necessary.
